
"There is no time like Spring,

Treefelling

THE option of felling the shelterbelts around Edderton and Balleigh (map attached) is being explored. According to the company, the shelterbelts are over mature exotic conifers which are now starting to suffer from windblow. The shelterbelts are becoming dangerous, and it has become necessary to fell them. It their intention to replace any shelterbelts away from the roadside with native broadleaves. The claim is that this will improve both the recreational and habitat value of the

woodlands.

Any shelterbelts that run along the roadside will be removed and a new native woodland created. The movement of timber will be designed to avoid disruption within the village. No timber wagons will run during school opening/closing hours.

The company say they would be delighted to get our thoughts on the matter. The felling operation is scheduled for around late summer/early autumn 2024.
