Edderton Community Council Grants Available

Winter Fuel Deadline

THE Edderton Community Council have introduced a top up to help people in the village after the UK government cut the Winter Fuel Allowance. Each household with someone aged

60 and over is entitled to a £200 Edderton Fuel Rebate, and have until 31/12/2024 to claim.

Skill Seekers Grant Up To £300.00

THIS grant is available annually for anyone that doing some form of training/re-training, these include University costs, driving lessons, the list goes on...

Smoke Alarm Grant Up To £200.00

THIS grant is available to help with the costs of installing smoke alarms to the required Scottish Government legislation.

Energy Conservation Grant Up To £300.00

THIS grant is to help with the costs of installing insulation, double glazing and anything to help energy conservation.

NEW START UP GRANT AVAILABLE
